At a time when other communities are closing the doors of these kinds of facilities, Meriter Hospital has gladly, and proudly, opened theirs.

## **Program UPDATE**

## Max Pohle Dental Clinic The Max W. Pohle Dental Clinic

serves as a primary dental care provider for patients requiring dental care during their hospitalization, underinsured or indigent patients, and mentally or physically disabled patients requiring special care.



Patient Care. The Dental Clinic

provides services covering the entire spectrum of dentistry to approximately 7,000 individuals, delivering over 5,500 patient visits in 2006. Since the Max Pohle Dental Clinic is one of only a handful of dental facilities in the state that have the ability to treat medically compromised patients in the operating room, the demand is great.

**General Practice Residency in Dentistry.** For twenty-nine years the Max Pohle Dental Clinic has trained dental school graduates through a one year residency program in general dentistry. The strengths of the residency program are the emphasis on clinical chairside training, the development of practice management skills, including treating underserved populations, and the opportunity to perform procedures not available in the undergraduate curriculum.

**Community Service.** The Max Pohle Dental Clinic participates in Seal Dane, a dental program that provides education and preventive treatment to children in Dane County at greatest risk of dental decay and disease. The program overcomes some of the barriers to dental care for children from low-income families by applying dental sealants to children's first permanent molars in a mobile clinic that goes to local schools. •

In the United States, an estimated 11 percent of children ages 9–17 have psychiatric illnesses that cause significant challenges in daily functioning. Closer to home, psychiatric problems are the leading cause of hospitalization for children in Wisconsin, and suicide is the second-leading cause of death for teens.

Research has documented that dance and movement are helpful for some patients with mental disorders, but most insurance doesn't cover these types of therapies. The Christensens recently stepped forward with an additional generous gift to fund movement and dance therapies for patients. Dianne, who has personally found dance and movement to be extremely helpful in her life, is pleased that children will have access to these therapies when they are recommended by the staff.

The Christensen's gifts are examples of why people give and the thoughtfulness behind their gifts. For the Christensens, it's not just about the money; it's about the impact of their gift.
